Note(s):

HHE institutions are those whose full-time equivalent (FTE) undergraduate student enrollment is at least 25% Hispanic, according to fall 2020 data in the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System, directed by the National Center for Education Statistics. FTE enrollment is calculated as full-time undergraduate student enrollment plus one-third of part-time undergraduate student enrollment. Ranked institutions are geographically separate campuses headed by a campus-level president or chancellor. Some campuses are part of large, multi-campus universities; some are part of state university systems.
